So we abandoned Titus Creek and made good use of the rentals and went in another direction. We toured many of the other great sites in the Valley.

The next day was the day scheduled for our bike ride. Russ Drake and Rick both had several options of trails to take. I was just looking to join in and experience whatever came down.

We all got up fairly early the next morning after having a great dinner, drinks and pit fire the night before. We got our gear on, bikes ready and off we went on our adventure. We went to a place called Dantes View. We went from 200+ feet below sea level to 5475 feet at the top of Dantes View. The temperature dropped into the low 40's. It felt to me like it was well into the 30's during the climb up to the top


Short Track Racing


